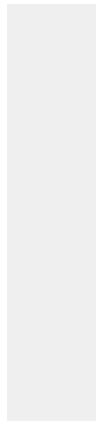


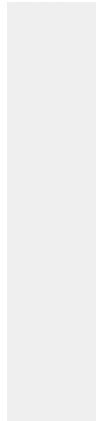
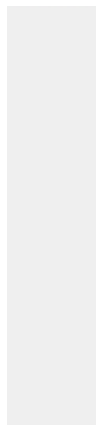
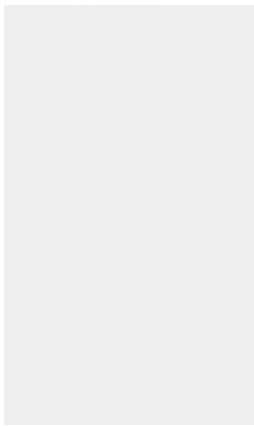
The breaking of a thousand hearts save one
